# **Passenger Vehicle Regulations**

#### **Section 65 (1)**

A Person shall not use a vehicle to transport goods unless

- a) The vehicle is constructed to carry the goods, and
- b) There is equipment on the vehicle or attached to the vehicle that is capable of securing the goods to ensure that the vehicle can be operated safely when loaded and without danger of
- i. Turning over the vehicle, or
- ii. The load shifting, swaying, blowing off, falling off, leaking or otherwise escaping

### Section 65 (2)

A person shall not operate a vehicle that is transporting goods unless the equipment referred to in subsection (1) (b) is properly used to secure the goods.

#### **Section 65 (3)**

The equipment referred to in subsection (1) (b) may be permanently attached to the vehicle or temporarily attached to the vehicle for the purpose of transporting a particular load of goods.

As per the Canadian Council of Motor Transport
Administrators (CCMTA), bungee cords and tarp straps
are not suitable for use as tie downs.

However, they may be used as a supplementary restraint for light weight cargo and equipment - i.e. for holding down a tarp.
